NATIONAL RTI DRAFTING COMPETITION

The time for cleaning up the economic environment and improved delivery of public service has come. There is a wave already, and government machinery is actively at work. However, there are areas which are hidden from the view. There is an opportunity for us to join the wave and do our bit in identifying the hidden areas, discovering crucial bits of missing information, and plugging the gaps.

Evaluation Process/ Scoring Criteria:

Equal weightage will be given to the following -

- Quality of RTI and Issues addressed – 50 marks
- Relevance of matter – 25 marks
- Quality of Article – 25 marks

Why should you enter?

- Identify important areas where information is needed and bring transparency in administration. If you do this consistently, you can start developing an expertise in the area of law (and provide niche consultancy around it).
- Get hands-on experience in drafting the RTI.
- The information received from public offices can be used to demonstrate the issues and its possible solution. It also helps in extracting the information about how the system functions.
- Identify areas where you need to pursue litigation or PILs to ensure smooth functioning of the administration or justice delivery.



Details of Competition:

- You have to file an RTI addressing one public department. Make sure your RTI provides information which is relevant for a section of the people. It should be able to provide some future points of action for people affected by the issue or for professionals supporting people in moving forward.
- You can take multidisciplinary themes coming under ambit of RTI Act, 2005. Competition does not stick to specific themes.
- You can submit more than one entry for the competition. For this, each entry will comprise of registration fee mentioned.
- For every fee paid, participants are allowed to submit one entry only.
- Competition will be in pen paper mode.
- You need to ensure that RTI is drafted properly and addressed to the correct government office.

- Submission
 - Each Participant must submit ONE PIL draft.
 - If a participant/team wishes to submit any annexure to support his/her arguments contained in the Draft [for instance Reports, Commentaries, News Clippings, Pictures, etc.] a compendium of all the relevant annexures must be prepared and should be carried on the day of competition in printed form.
 - Handwritten PIL on any contemporary legal issue must be accompanied by all the relevant printed documents brought by the participant.
 - All the relevant documents which are carried out by the participant will be checked before drafting of PIL. Admissibility of the documents and rights to allow reserve with the organizers.
 - **No unfair means are allowed, if found candidature will be canceled.**
 - **Any submission with any name reference of the participant will be disqualified.**
 - **Submission will be done only on the day of competition in hard copy only. Event is offline in nature.**

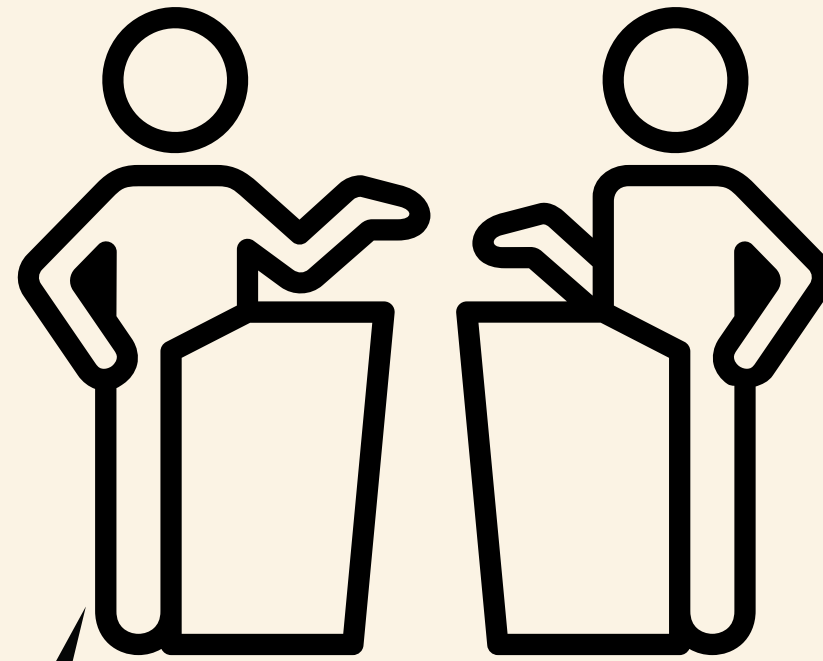

It is open for all school, undergraduate and post-graduate students of multidisciplinary streams from various schools, colleges and universities across the country.

NATIONAL DEBATE COMPETITION

Details of Competition:

- 1- Preliminary Round: 2+1 minutes will be given for speaking. Timings will be shown to participants twice once after one minute, and then at the end. Rebuttal session will be of one minutes to each participant.
- 2- Semi-Finals and Finals: It comprises Affirmative statements, cross-examination by negative speakers, negative statements, cross-examination by positive speakers. Then there will be a rebuttal session including the first affirmative rebuttal and negative rebuttal.
 - 4+1 minutes will be given for speaking. Timings will be shown to participants twice, once after three minutes, and then at the end. Rebuttal session will be of one minutes to each participant.
- 3- The participants will be informed about the new topic for semi-finals and finals and “For the motion” or “Against the motion” 30 mins prior to the commencement of the round.
- 4- Medium for the debate is Bilingual (English or Hindi).
- 5- The speakers are recommended to deliver their speech in either of the languages.
NO mixture of languages in speech is allowed.
- 6- Professional decorum should be maintained by participants during the whole event. Use of cuss words will immediately disqualify the concerned participant from the competition.
- 7- Scores will be provided after the completion of respective rounds.
- 8- A unique code will be allotted to participants before the competition. It is advised to use that code for further reference and communication during the event. In case of disclosure of identity by any participant, he/she will be disqualified.
- 9- Final results for the competition will be announced by the judging panel and it'll be binding on everyone.

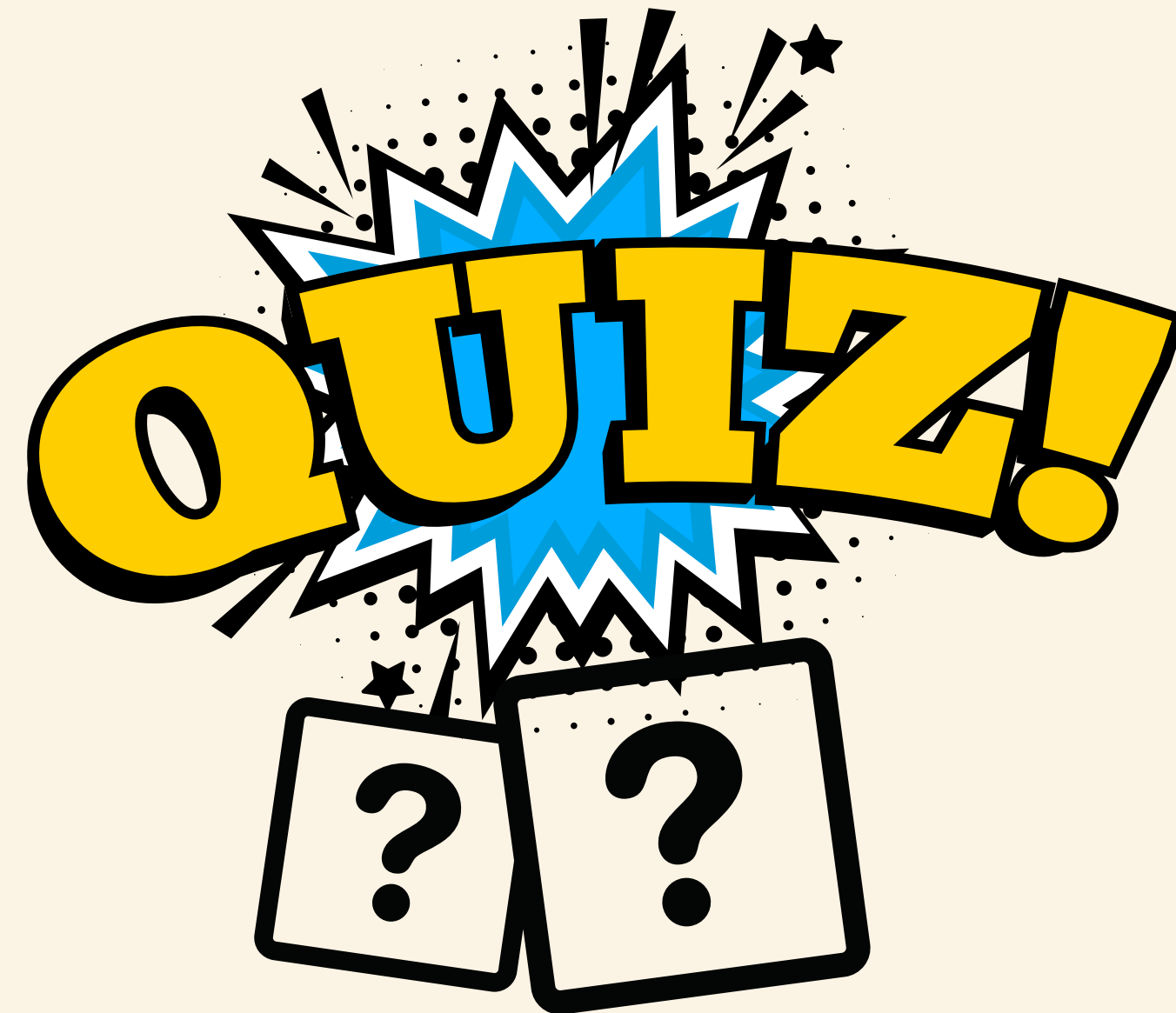

- The body of the paper shall be in Times New Roman, font size 12, 1.5 line spacing. Footnotes should be in Times New Roman, size 10 single line spacing.
- Word limit shall range between 2,500 to 3,000 words (excluding footnotes).
- The paper shall be original and unpublished. (The paper should not be plagiarized, and free from grammatical, spelling, and other errors).
- The margin should be 1" or 2.54 cm on all sides.
- Page number should be mentioned at the bottom right.

Official Language

The official language of the Competition shall be English. All written and/or oral submission made to and/or before the judges shall be in English.

Details of Competition:

- The Competition shall simulate a client's interview at a law office/chamber.
- Each round shall be divided broadly into two segments, i.e. (a) client-consultation session and (b) post-consultation session.
- In the client-consultation session, Participants shall be expected to extract fact information from the client, briefly analyze the issue(s) at hand, and make recommendations to the client in order to resolve his or her problem.
- In the post-consultation session, the Participants shall be expected to legally analyze the interview and the various issues the matter (or case) presents and discuss a future course of action. They shall further be expected to discuss the recommendations made by them to the client and whether an alternative approach could be or have been adopted to attain a better outcome from the session. The judges may, during this period, question the participants on their presentation.
- It is clarified here that the Participants may tender legal advice to their client(s) with reference only to the laws prevailing to the country of his or her residence.

NATIONAL CLIENT COUNSELLING COMPETITION

Participants are advised to keep in mind professional rules of ethics and conduct, as are applicable to lawyers, and act in accordance with them during rounds. All participants, regardless of the country of their residence, shall be deemed subject to the rules and regulations as issued by the Bar Council of India under the Advocates Act, 1961 or any other regulatory body.

CLIENT PROBLEM FOR THE COMPETITION

Rahul Sharma aged 30 yrs. resides at House no 732, MI Road, Jaipur. He is a senior engineer working as a Manager at CCS EdTech Company and lives with his parents and younger brother Rishi.

He got married to Selena on 15th March 2012 under the special marriage act, she is a well-known cardiologist. After one year of marriage, they were blessed with a daughter named Rose on 21st November 2013. Selena was an extravagant person. She believed in extra expenses on unnecessary things which were quite troublesome to their financial condition. On the other hand, her husband spent in a very controlled way. Due to the pandemic, Rahul lost his job on 20th May 2020 and soon they ran out of money which led to a financial crisis in their house resulting in problems as his wife did not provide consent to adapt to the changed situation. She didn't change her way of living and she tried every little effort to maintain her standard of living.

Rahul tried to convince his wife but Selena did not change her nature and eventually, this created a dispute between them. Due to these arguments on daily basis, Selena became mentally disturbed and decided to leave her matrimonial house alone without any cash or jewellery.

CLIENT PROBLEM FOR THE COMPETITION

The next day, Selena came to her matrimonial house with some police officers. After which Rahul got to know that Selena have lodged a False FIR against him & his parents on 21st December 2020 under section 498 A, 406 & 323 of IPC & charges of Domestic violence. She even showed her false bruises and injury marks on her body about which Rahul had no idea. Eventually, police arrested Rahul and his Parents Immediately which led to their gross humiliation.

In the present scenario, Rahul's younger brother Rishi wants legal advice regarding the arrest of his elder brother and parents and wants them out of jail as the whole incident hampered the image of his family in society.

Client Instructions: This is your basic story; you are free to fill in any gaps in the facts or in your personal history in any way that seems appropriate. You may not change any of the facts in this account, or say anything directly contradictory to these facts. You may adopt any attitude you like with your lawyer, as long as it is consistent with the story.

Definitions

- “MCC RLF” – Moot Court Committee Rajasthan Law Festival, Vidhishala, Jaipur. The MCC is the organizing and administering body for the Competition.
- “Competition” – 2st RLF National Client Counseling Competition.
- “Participant” – Any individual eligible and participating in the Competition.
- “Team” – Any team comprising not more than three participants, eligible and participating in the Competition.
- “Undergraduate student of law” – Any student enrolled in an undergraduate, dual-degree (5 years) course of law at a college and/or university recognized by the University Grants Commission.
- “Professional student of law” – Any student enrolled in a professional (3 years) course of law at a college and/or university recognized by the University Grants Commission.
- “Lawyer” – A person who practices law, such as an attorney, or a solicitor, or a legal practitioner.
- “Country of residence” – For the sake of this Competition, any and every client’s country of residence shall be as mentioned in the office memo for a particular round.
- “Client” – A person or organization, as assigned by the MCA, RLF in accordance with the office memo for a particular round, seeking and/or receiving the services of a lawyer(s), as defined in 2.7.
- “Office memo” – A sheet of correspondence briefly describing the client(s) and/or his or her problem(s) for which s/he seeks the services of a lawyer(s).

Rounds

- The Competition shall comprise of preliminary round following which, teams with highest score shall qualify for the quarter-final rounds on the basis of their absolute score in the preliminary round.
- Teams with the highest absolute score in the quarter-final round shall qualify to the semi-final round.
- Two teams with the highest absolute score shall qualify from the semi-final rounds to the final round.
- The winner of the final round, decided based on the highest absolute score in the final round, shall be declared winner of the Competition.

Provided that any dispute arising out of such rounds shall be resolved by the MCC, RLF. The decision of the MCC, RLF shall be final in such regard.

Use of external equipment(s)

- Participants are expected not to bring any props or office furnishings of the kind, for usage during the rounds. There shall be no marking done based on such extra-offerings.
- Provided that this shall not be construed as a prohibition against bringing books or any other relevant materials into the room.

Time Limits

The Client-Consultation Sessions shall be of the following lengths respectively:

Preliminary Rounds: 15 minutes

Quarter- Final Round: 15 minutes

Semi-Final Rounds: 30 minutes

Final Round : 40 minutes

In each round, other than the Final Round, teams shall have not more than 5 minutes for the Post-Consultation Session. In the Final Rounds, 10 minutes shall be provided for the same.

Rules of Participation

- The matchups shall be released on the basis of team codes.
- Upon breaking, two teams from each group shall qualify to the quarter-final rounds.
- The breaks shall be decided on the basis of absolute scores, i.e. The top teams shall qualify.
- In the event of a tie of scores between two teams, the same shall be resolved on the basis of –
 - First, the aggregate points of problem analysis, followed by client's goals and expectations (in case the aggregate points in problem analysis are the same), followed by obtaining information (in case the aggregate points in client's goals and expectations are the same); and
 - Second, on the basis of a coin (unbiased) toss, if and only if the tie is not resolved by the abovementioned method.
 - The matchups of the semi-final rounds shall be on the basis of power matchups.
